
JENNIFER HORN, RLA

### GREEN SPRING VALLEY

Nestled on several wooded acres is a respite designed to welcome guests alongside a pavilion dedicated to health and wellness. An airy guesthouse serves as a light-filled getaway, and a gorgeous gym, spa, and pool are perfectly positioned to provide gathering places where guests can take in valley views. A serpentine stone staircase provides easy access leading from the terrace that surrounds the upper gym roof down to the edge of the pool below. A green roof constructed over the garage creates an elevated, walkable green space and serves to tie the multiple elevations of the property together.

The interior of the home boasts beautiful antique white oak timber elements and extensive millwork. Specialty finishes include faux limestone, Venetian plaster, and a lighted onyx accent wall in the massage room adjacent to a barber room. Thoroughly modern updates include a fully customized home automation and control system and professional home theater. This epicenter of health, wellness, and hospitality creates the perfect bucolic retreat.

### SPRING VALLEY

Empty nesters who desired to reimagine their home's country French aesthetic after their children moved out sought to create a more streamlined, modern, sophisticated version of its former self. Extreme attention to detail ruled the redesign. Specialty wall finishes, including faux limestone and Venetian plaster, created intriguing textures. Stone elements sourced specifically for this project include Castille Grey Limestone floor tile from Romania, a floating vanity sink carved from a single block of Belgian Bluestone, Pyrolave Volcanic Lava island tops, and counters and trim elements of Statuary Marble. Decorative furnishings add appeal throughout the home, such as the antique mirrors specially handcrafted in England, positioned to create a dramatic backdrop at the breakfast room bar. Customized mud-in recess fixtures, lighted closet rods, integrated cabinet lighting, and custom art lights brighten the interior. Keeping this home's beautiful bones intact while giving it a fresh feel allowed this classic beauty to realize its true potential.

## LITTLE MAGOTHY

This renovation tells the story of a classic 1930s farmhouse, reimagined. The complete overhaul modernized and expanded the original home while enhancing the visibility of its stunning views of the Little Magothy River.

The undertaking was enormous. The home's original interior was completely gutted, its mechanical systems replaced to reduce energy demands, and the aging structure stabilized. A 3,000-square foot addition provides copious, modernized space. Many of the renovations were thoughtfully planned to allow for enhanced enjoyment of the bucolic surroundings. The first-floor rooms open to an expansive deck with unobstructed views looking north to Gibson Island and the Chesapeake Bay. The bedroom suites share the waterfront view and an eastern exposure to surrounding cornfields that are still farmed yearly. The garage-turned-poolhouse was renovated to add a home office, guest rooms with full bathroom, a laundry room, a changing room for pool guests, and a three-car garage. Atop the garage sits an additional guest room and home gym. A large gathering space in the pool house features 24 ft. ceilings, a kitchen, and a stone fireplace. A loft area, accessible only by a custom teak ladder, offers three built-in bunks. The expansive renovations render the property ripe for memory making.
